# Schleißheim Castle, Munich

### Construction measure

### Brief description

The splendid palace grounds are deemed the Versailles of Bavaria. The complex consists of the old palace built under the reign of Wilhelm V. as a stately home and newer buildings commissioned by Prince Elector Max Emanuel in 1693 after his victory over the Turks. The old palace was nearly completely destroyed during World War II and parts of it only reconstructed in 1972. Today it harbours a branch of the Bavarian National Museum.
