Description

In 1584, the Haus zum Breiten Herd was built by order of the council master and town bailiff Heinrich von Denstedt. Today it forms an impressive house in the fish market. Particularly worth seeing are the many decorative elements on the valuable Renaissance building, especially the five-senses - See - Hear - Smell - Taste - Feel). The Haus zum Breiten Herd and the adjacent Gasthof zum Stötzel have been owned by the Erfurt Chamber of Crafts since 1929. Translated with www.DeepL.com/Translator (free version)

Problem

The microbiological load of the building bricks and the high mobility of the stored hygroscopic magnesium sulphates required adequate moisture protection in the area of the paint setting systems. Due to the high salt loads, a hydrophobic impregnation was ruled out. In order to minimize the water ingress via the facade surface and the associated damage processes, a silicone resin paint was selected.
